Focus and Scope

Forests and Natural Environment (FNE) is a peer-reviewed international journal that publishes original research and review articles on forest and natural ecosystems, sustainability, environmental protection, management and conservation of wildlife and natural resources.

The journal aims to provide a medium for communication between researchers and practitioners and to foster collaborative research.

It scopes to bring together academics and researchers mainly involved with forestry and natural environment research by publishing papers that are listed but not limited to following areas:

Silviculture, forest ecology, biodiversity, paleoecology, vegetation, wildlife, conservation monitoring, management, climate change impacts, adaptation and mitigation in forests, wildland fires, forest entomology, forest pathology, forest genetics, plant breeding, genetic resources, forest soil research, urban forests, agroforestry, forestry ergonomics and labour, wood technology, wood science, grazing ecology and rangeland ecosystem management, mountain water resources, forest engineering, environmental impact assessment, forest inventory, quantitative methods, and remote sensing, forest law and environmental legislation, forest economics, natural resource policy and planning, forest recreation, eco-tourism, information technologies in natural resources, forest ergonomics, non-wood forest products.

Author Guidelines

BEFORE SUBMITTING:

If you are considering to submit your manucsript for assessment and publication, please make sure that you have read and are accorded with our Editorial Policies.

Paper types (categories): The Journal publishes research articles, short communications and reviews in English.

- Research articles report the results of an original, completed work presenting novel results of broad interest in a field related to the journal's aims and scope.
- Short Communications should cover original, completed studies (not preliminary findings) with a focused message to readers.
- The journal publishes also critical reviews that synthesize information on an important topic of broad interest, within the journal's aims and scope; reviews can exceed the length limits of articles. Authors are asked to contact the Editor-in-Chief prior to submission of critical reviews.

Submission of a manuscript implies that:

- the research described has not been published elsewhere (except in a book of abstracts, in the
 proceedings of a scientific meeting or as part of a thesis in a personal webpage or an
 institutional repository),
- the manuscript is not considered for publication in another journal,
- co-authors have approved and authorized manuscript submission,

SUBMISSION:

Manuscript preparation:

Language: The Journal accepts manuscripts written in English (spelling can be either British or American, as long as it is consistent throughout the manuscript).

Layout: Manuscripts should be prepared with the Microsoft Word using double-line spacing and line numbering. The preferable fonts are Times New Roman, Arial, Calibri and Aptos, all at size 12. The paper should be of size A4 with 2.5 cm margins on all sides. Please use SI units throughout your manuscript. Research articles should not exceed 7,000 words and short communications should be limited to 3,500 words (supplements, if any, are excluded).

Abstract: Abstract (300 words maximum). The abstract should be a concise summary of the research, describing the aim of study, the study area (if any), the material and methods used and a further mention of the main results. At the end of the Abstract you may report the research highlights using one or two closing sentences with most relevant findings and implications.

Keywords: Provide 3 to 6 keywords (not used in the title).

Article's main text: We strongly recommend that the text of the article should contain the following sections:

Introduction: Please describe the state-of-the-art in your research field and provide readers with the necessary reference publications. You may also consider presenting any controversial and diverging hypotheses relative to your work. At the end of the Introduction, briefly mention the main aim of the work. Please note that the introduction section should be understood by non- specialists.

Material and Methods: Please use this section to present your methodology. Sufficient information should be provided to enable experiments to be repeated. For routine methods, a brief description and literature reference may suffice. New methods, however, must be described in detail in order to permit repeatability of the research.

Results: Include in this section the results of your experiment or simulation. Note that references are not expected to appear in this section. Interpretations of the experimental data should be reserved for the Discussion section. Any explanations provided in Figure captions and/or in Table titles and footnotes should not be repeated in the text.

Discussion: Please use this section to write the Discussion. Keep the discussion focused on your results avoiding speculative comments. You may present the relevance of your findings, the practical or theoretical implications and how your results relate to the literature review and the aims of your study.

Conflict of interest: A statement regarding any potential conflict of interest should be reported.

Acknowledgements: If necessary, acknowledgements should be made to persons or institutions that supported the work.

References: All references (in -text and reference list) should abide by the <u>APA Style</u> (7th ed.) specifications. For further help, please consult AUTh's Library APA Citation Style Guide.

Supplementary material: Supplementary material (large tables, raw data, etc.) should be submitted as a separate file. Supplements will be peer reviewed by the editors and the peer reviewers.

Revised manuscripts: A letter containing a detailed (point-by-point) reply to the reviewers and editor's comments is required with any revised version. A revised manuscript will retain its original date of receipt only if it is received within three months after the date of revision.

AFTER MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION:

Upon successful submission, the corresponding author will be also notified by e-mail. This journal follows a double-blind reviewing procedure.
